

Download Gender Shrapnel In The Academic Workplace

The project interweaves stories of gender shrapnel with an examination of national rhetoric surrounding business, education, and law to uncover underlying phenomena that contribute to discourse on privilege and gender in the academic workplace. The book that spawned this blog, *Gender Shrapnel in the Academic Workplace* (Palgrave, 2016), provides narratives of gender shrapnel—often intersecting with race, class, and other intersectional categories—, researches its root problems, and offers solutions and case studies.
